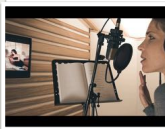
Director's Playbook

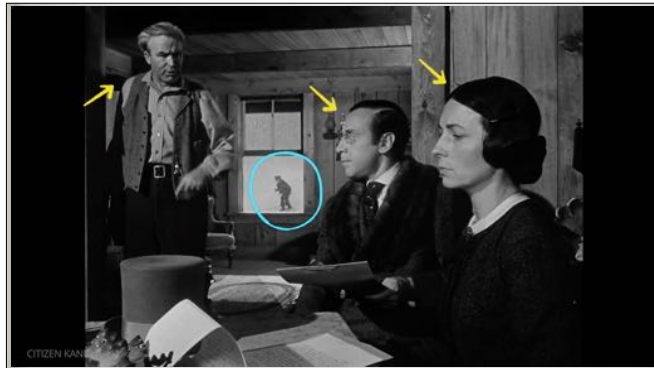
