4. This film, like many others, uses a lot of dialogue scenes – which can become boring for an audience if it is not done well. Describe specifically how the director, Gus Van Sant, or the actors made these dialogue scenes engaging.

5. How does this film utilize the cinematic technique of "showing rather than telling"? Describe one or more scenes that utilizes this technique.

6. Choose ONE scene that stood out to you. Discuss the mise-en-scene of your example, which could include the use of color, composition, lighting, camera work, sound, or blocking.
